PROCESS

The home occupation application will be sent and reviewed by the appropriate agencies i.e., city/county board of health, fire department, building department, etc.

The Staff will process the application by mailing out letters to all property owners within 300 feet of the proposed home occupation. If there is no opposition to the use received within 10 days after the mailing the Staff will finalize the application after receiving recommendations from other agencies.

If a public meeting is needed before the Planning Commission the Staff will send additional letters out to the neighbors notifying them of a public meeting. The Planning Commission meets on the second and fourth Thursdays at 7:00 p.m. in the Herriman Community Center.

A home occupation conditional use approval expires 2 years from the date of the approval given if the applicant does not obtain a business license.

APPEAL

A letter to the Herriman City Council may appeal the final decision of the Planning Commission within 10 days after the date of the Planning Commission action.
