Spring is the Time of Plans and Projects

Spring is in the air! Flowers are in bloom, birds are singing, and temperatures are rising. With this transformation from hazy shades of winter, many look forward to spring colors that make us long to be outside and start to plan our vacations.

For Herriman City, this time of year kickstarts our planning phase as well. With the conclusion of the legislative session and our budget preparation in full force, City leadership has the future of Herriman heavy on their minds. With roughly 65,000 residents, Herriman is no stranger to growth. Knowing the build-out is just over the 100,000 resident mark, planning for a viable, sustainable future is key. We are a city in transition, working on constructive strategies to enhance the quality of life and preserve our history.

We have been working on updating and amending the General Plan. This has been a long process as we put forth effort in creating a strong guiding document that includes input from you, our community. Public engagement is critical in drafting this plan, and we invite you to participate in the community meetings taking place in April. This is a great opportunity for us to plan for the future and address emerging trends and challenges, both locally and regionally, as they impact our city. Infrastructure, parks, and open space, as well as thoughtfully planned land use, appear to be a priority among our residents. The General Plan is a comprehensive plan that will reflect the community's values and priorities and serve as a guide for allocating City resources. As we work through the general plan process, we also explore the possibility of future annexations. One such annexation that has been evaluated in recent Council meetings is the Olympia Hills development on our northwest border. Staff members have been directed to put together a financial analysis on the impacts of this development to include its effects if it is outside our city limits compared to if it is annexed. The City Council has also requested an update to the 2018 Bonneville Study to determine the impacts the approved development will have on our

What's Your Say in How Your City's Money is Spent?

The budget is the lifeblood of a city. It sets the course for an entire year of services like public safety, new and repaired infrastructure, parks and open space, construction inspection, legislative activity, and so much more.

Herriman City's fiscal year begins July 1 and ends June 30th. Preparation for the upcoming year begins in January. City management works with the Budget Committee to determine needs for their respective departments and the community while staying safely within the confines of a responsible budget.

The City seeks to be transparent and accountable to its residents. The proposed 2021 budget is presented to the City Council on April 14th. Over the next month, the Council analyzes the proposal and gives feedback. On May 12th, the Council approves a full tentative (not final) budget and turns to the community for its feedback. The City invites resident input, including in a public hearing on May 26th. Any necessary changes are made before the Council approves the budget (anticipated on June 9th).

When the tentative budget is approved, it is published on www.herriman.org/budgets for you to review. The City works hard to make the budget understandable to those unfamiliar with government finance. You are encouraged to review the budget and give your feedback to your City leadership.

6400 West Main Street Traffic Signal

On March 10th, a tragic auto accident occurred at 6400 West and Main Street. Our deepest sympathies go out to all those affected.

Herriman City received many inquiries shortly afterward about the need for a traffic signal at this location to help improve safety. Herriman City has been working on installation of a signal in this intersection. The budget for this very project was approved last summer for the current fiscal year. The City was recently able to secure the right-of-way for that traffic signal in September. The project, which has already been combined with a water line project in the same area, went to bid in February and a contractor was selected in the same month. The contractor has agreed to expedite the project as much as possible.

Substantial completion for the project is anticipated for May 21, at which point the traffic signal will be installed. Its completion is estimated to be by the end of June.

Again, our hearts go out to those affected by the March 10th accident.





Find Ways to Save

Utah Governor Cox declared a state of emergency for drought conditions on March 17, 2021. 100% of the state is in a moderate drought, and 90% is experiencing extreme drought. Following a record dry summer and fall, the winter's snowpack is about 70% of average for the year. "Unfortunately, we have not received enough snow to offset the dry conditions," said Gov. Cox. "I ask Utahns to evaluate their water use and find ways to save...because we live in one of the driest states in the nation."

Herriman City adopted water efficiency standards by ordinance in December 2020 to help preserve the public's water resources and reduce overall per capita water use. The Standards set new recommendations and requirements for both indoor water fixtures and exterior landscape and irrigation systems.


Juniper Canyon Campus at Herriman

Salt Lake Community College's funding for a new campus in Herriman was recently restored. SLCC is on track to break ground on the Juniper Canyon Campus this summer, with plans to have its first building open in 2023. The new campus will offer both SLCC and University of Utah classes to adults and high school students.

In a statement to The Salt Lake Tribune, SLCC President Deneece Huftalin said, "The goal is to help people stay in Herriman and not have to cross the entire valley to get to the U."

As a model of sustainable innovation and education, the Juniper Canyon Campus at Herriman will engage the community, foster economic stewardship, and serve as a destination for state-of-the-art programs.

"Anytime you have a campus like this that comes into your community, it will spur growth," stated Herriman Assistant City Manager Tami Moody. "The City Council has been anticipating the day when we can break ground on this campus. City officials are excited to see that the funding is back this year."

- Asking you to purchase gift cards to pay taxes, warrants, legal fees, or bail
- A caller who is claiming to be from the IRS, Social Security, police, or any government agency and is demanding money



How to prevent being the victim of a scam:



- Don't be afraid to hang up
- Government and honest companies will never ask for a gift card as payment
- Report it to the police
- Search online...look up a person, company, or phone number to find if they have been reported as being tied to a scam
- Contact someone you trust and ask what they think
- Never pay up front for a promise
- Never give out personal info unless you're positive who you're talking to and you've called them

Parks Preparation

Spring is here, which marks the start of the busy season for Herriman's Parks Department. However, staff have already been busy preparing for spring for several months. In February, crews started overseeding field so that the seed will germinate as soon as the ground temperatures reach 55 degrees. In March, they started aerating all turf areas within the city, as well as applying the first round of fertilizer and preemergent. As soon as nighttime temperatures consistently remain above freezing, usually around the middle of April, crews begin the arduous process of starting up the irrigation systems.

With over 100 irrigation controllers, each controlling dozens of valves and hundreds of heads, there are tens of thousands of irrigation components that must be checked, repaired, and adjusted before the summer heat hits hard. And just when they have completed checking everything in their areas, it is time for crews to repeat the process to ensure that all heads maintain proper coverage and are not wasting precious water.

This process helps to keep Herriman parks lush and green while being as conservative with irrigation water as possible.

Do Your Part, Protect Your Water

As the weather turns warm and you begin to start up your sprinkling system, remember to keep cross connection (backflow prevention) in mind.

Supplying safe clean drinking water is a high priority for Herriman City. The cross connection control program, along with the cooperation of customers, will help to ensure the delivery of safe clean drinking water.


To protect you and your family from contaminates entering your culinary drinking water, and to abide by the Herriman City ordinance 12-35-12 along with the Federal Safe Drinking Act Amendments of 1996, the backflow preventer **must** be tested **annually**.
