ORDINANCE NO. 14-11

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WATER FEE AND RATE STRUCTURE WITH
RESPECT TO A HYDRANT METER AND RESTATING THE WATER FEE AND
RATE STRUCTURE AND ENACTING RELATED PROVISIONS, ESTABLISHING
ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES, AND ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS AND
BACKFLOW PREVENTION**

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2014 the City Council (the "*Council*") met in regular session to consider, among other things, amending the water fee and rate structure with respect to a hydrant meter and restating the water fee and rate structure and enacting related provisions, establishing enforcement procedures, and establishing requirements and backflow prevention; and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Herriman to amend the water fee and rate structure with respect to a hydrant meter (showing the changes by underlining the changes) and restate the water fee and rate structure and enact related provisions, establish enforcement procedures, and establish requirements and backflow prevention.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council that the ordinance regarding water fees and rate structure and enacting related provisions and establishing enforcement procedures be amended, showing the changes by underlining the changes, and restated in its entirety as follows:

Furnishing Culinary Water Outside Corporate Limits.

The City has determined that it does not currently have surplus water and is not willing to provide new water connections to individual homeowners and developers outside the City corporate limits, unless they annex to the City as provided herein. As a condition for a new water connection for individual homeowners and developers outside the City corporate limits, such applicants must sign and deliver to the City a standard notice of intent and annexation petition, and the City must adopt an ordinance annexing such property(ies).

Furnishing of Water -Application Required.

A. No culinary water shall be furnished to any house, tenement, apartment, building, place, premises or lot, whether such water is for the use of the owner or tenant, unless the application for water shall be made in writing, signed by such owner or the owner's duly authorized agents, in which application the owner shall agree to pay for all water furnished thereto according to City ordinances, rules, and regulations.

B. In case an application to furnish water shall be made by a tenant of the owner, as a condition of granting the same, such owner or the owner's duly authorized agent must either cosign the application or sign a separate agreement which provides that, in consideration of the granting of such application, the owner will pay for all water furnished such tenant, or any other

occupant of the place named in the application, in case such tenant or occupant shall fail to pay the same in accordance with the City's ordinances, rules, and regulations.

Application -Contents.

The applicant shall state fully and truly the purpose for which water is required, and shall agree to conform to and be governed by such ordinances, rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the City for the control of the water supply. The applicant(s) agrees to be responsible for and pay all bills due the City on account of materials or labor furnished, as provided herein, as well as for all water delivered to the premises.

Previous Charges.

Absent a valid lien, an owner is not required to pay for water that was furnished to the property before the owner's ownership. Absent a valid lien, the City may not use an owner's failure to pay for water furnished to the owner's property as a basis for not furnishing water to the property after ownership of the property is transferred to a subsequent owner.

Connection and Other Facilities.

In all cases, the pipe and type of materials to be furnished and installed in the public right-of-way or per written agreement that are to be maintained by the City shall be approved by the City and shall be under its exclusive control. All excavation and other permits necessary shall be obtained at the expense of the applicant. Pipe and material outside the public way and pipe and materials installed as private pipelines or services shall be maintained by the property owners.

Water Use May be Limited by Proclamation.

In the event of the scarcity of water, whenever it shall be necessary, in the judgment of the City Council, the City Council shall by ordinance limit the use of water for other than domestic purposes, to such extent as may be required for the public good.

Violation of Proclamation Prohibited -Penalty.

It is unlawful for any person, by himself or herself, family, servants or agents, to violate the water use proclamation made pursuant to the previous section, and if any violation thereof shall occur, then in addition to any other penalty therefor the water supply to the premises upon which such violation occurs shall be shut off, and if shut off on that account, it shall not be turned on again until the payment of such amount for each violation as set forth on the proclamation.

Connections from Mains -Specifications.

The service pipes and connections from the main to the water meter, including the meter box, a meter yoke and valve are to be placed within the parking strip by a licensed, bonded plumber, to City standards, and subject to City inspection and approval. The City or its designee shall install the water meter. The plumber shall warrant the work and facilities installed by him against defects in workmanship or materials for a period of one year from date of acceptance thereof by the City.

Permit -Required for Work on Water Pipes.

No person shall make any alterations, additions or disconnections, or connections to, or in any manner perform any work upon any of the mains, connections or appliances pertaining to the

City waterworks until such person shall have received a written permit to do such work granted by the City.

Unlawful to Bypass Water Meter.

Except with a City-issued device to bypass a water meter or connection, it is unlawful for any person to use any means or device to bypass a water meter or connection to a waterline without a water meter. Any person or entity violating this provision shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by a fine not less than or equal to \$1,000.

Service Pipes -Materials and Installation.

All service and other pipes used underground shall be of a type and size approved by the City, laid not less than four feet below the surface of the ground, and of sufficient strength to stand the water pressure. All work upon alterations or extensions of water pipes, shall be subject to acceptance of the City.

Service Pipes -Minimum Size.

The minimum size for service Pipes shall be one (1) inch. The minimum size for main line shall be eight (8) inches.

Service to Individual Buildings.

No consumer shall be permitted to conduct water pipes across lots or buildings to adjoining premises, and each house abutting on a City water main must be supplied through its own separate service pipe running at right angles to the main.

Separate Trenches for Water and Sewer Pipes.

No water pipe shall be roughed out closer than three feet from the sewer pipe at the foundation of any building, and shall not be laid in the same trench with the sewer line or be so constructed as to cross the sewer line, and no water pipes shall be laid in the same trench as sewer, gas or any other pipe, but a separate trench must be provided for such water pipe at least three feet horizontally from all other pipelines.

Service Pipes -Valve Arrangement.

Valves required for service pipes must be so arranged that the supply to each separate house or premises may be controlled by a separate meter and valve.

Valves -Location -Accessible Position.

When a water pipe enters a building, plumbers must supply such pipe with a valve with a handle or wrench fixed thereto for the purpose of turning the same. Such valves shall be placed on the pipe in an accessible position. All such pipes shall enter buildings at the excavated portions thereof. All valves, meters and connections for meters shall be located in accessible places.

Valves -Repositioning After Repairs.

In all cases when plumbers shall make repairs to pipes or fixtures on any premises, they shall leave the water turned on or turned off as they found it when they entered the premises to make such repairs.

Valves -Unauthorized Operation Prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person other than duly authorized agents of the City to open or close any water valve in the water system of the City. Any person or entity violating this provision shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not less than or equal to \$1,000.

Water Shutoff Authorized When.

The City reserves the right at any time, without notice, to shut off the water from its mains for the purpose of making repairs or extensions, or for other purposes, and no claim shall be made against the City, by reason of any breakage whatsoever, or for any damage that may result from shutting off the water for repairing, laying or relaying mains, hydrants or other connections, or for any other reason whatsoever.

Good Repair of Private Service Required.

All water takers shall keep their service pipes, connections and other apparatus in good repair and protected from frost at their own expense.

Opening Meter Boxes -Damages.

The opening of meter boxes by any means other than a proper wrench is unlawful. Any person breaking a meter box cover or bolt will be required to pay for the complete repair of the meter box. Any person or entity violating this provision shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not less than or equal to \$1,000.

Interfering with Meter Prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person by himself or herself, family, servants, or agents, to open, interfere with, injure, deface, or in any way impair the workings of any water meter.

Removing Meter Prohibited -Exception.

It is unlawful for any person other than a duly authorized agent or the City to remove any water meter from any premises. Any person or entity violating this provision shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine not less than or equal to \$1,000.

Turnoff Allowed for Certain Repairs.

In case of leaks or other accidents damaging service pipes, or other apparatus connected with the City waterworks, plumbers, and homeowners may shut off the water at the meter to make necessary repairs.

Approval Required Prior to Extension of Water Mains.

No water mains or pipes shall be laid nor shall permission be given to lay water mains or pipes to supply water from the waterworks system of the City to the occupants of any plat, addition or subdivision of any block, lot or tract of ground within the City, unless the plat, addition or subdivision shall have been approved by the City.

Fire Hydrants -Use by Contractors -Fees.

The City may give permission, for which a fee shall be set and charged by the City, for the use of water from fire hydrants by applicants who are engaged in work within the City. All water used from fire hydrants shall be metered through a City-owned meter which shall be rented from the City.

Use of Water from Hydrants -Application.

Applications for the use of water from fire hydrants must be made in writing stating the purpose for which the water is to be used, approximate length of time the applicant desires to use the water, and must be signed by the applicant or the applicant's authorized agent, agreeing to the conditions for such use, rate, and payment as set and determined by the City.

Fire Hydrants -Unauthorized Use Prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person, other than those duly authorized, to open or operate any fire hydrant or to tamper or interfere with or attempt to draw water therefrom, or in any way to obstruct the approach thereto.

Average Rate Charged when Meter Fails.

When for any reason the water meter shall fail to register, or the meter cannot be read, a bill shall be rendered at the average rate of consumption for like periods of time. Billing Period. Bills for water used through meters shall be rendered monthly; the City shall determine from time to time when monthly meter readings shall be made and bills rendered.

Using Water Without Payment Prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person, by himself, herself, family, servants or agents to use the water coming through the water mains without first agreeing to and paying for all water delivered, as provided herein.

Water Rates and Related Charges.

As of April 1, 2014, the charge for water, inside and outside the corporate limits of the City, shall be the aggregate of the base rate and usage rate as follows:

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E. Residential User. For purposes of this Ordinance, residential user means water services to a structure intended to be occupied for residential living purposes.

F. Nonresidential User. For purposes of this Ordinance, nonresidential user means water services to a structure not intended to be occupied for residential living purposes.

G. Master Meter Residential. The City may, at its option, approve the installation of a single master meter which services multiple residential users. Such an approval is intended as a cost-saving measure and is done for the benefit of the developer of the project. An approval of the master meter does not constitute a waiver of the City's right to collect the water fees from a home owners association or each individual user unit.

Payment and Enforcement Provisions.

A. Bills for water are due **and** payable thirty (30) days after their rendition. Customers who do not pay the full amount of the water bill on or before the due date are in default and subject to disconnection and collection of delinquent amounts as provided herein.

B. Delinquent accounts will be charged a delinquent account fee equal to 1.5% of the delinquent balance amount at the beginning of each month the account is delinquent.

C. A notice of delinquency will be sent to the billing address after the account has been delinquent for sixty (60) days. The notice shall notify the customer that if full payment is not received within the next seven (7) days, that their service(s) will be subject to termination. The notice shall also invite the customer to contact the City during this seven (7) day period to make special arrangements under extenuating circumstances, which may be approved by the City as provided below.

D. The City may maintain an action to receive the amounts, and accounts which are still delinquent after seven (7) days from the date of the Notice of Delinquency will be subject to termination of service (shut off) on a date that is convenient to the City.

E. Service termination for nonpayment shall not be reinstated (reconnected) unless payment of the unpaid balance is paid together with a reconnection fee in the amount of \$75.

F. A deferred payment agreement may be entered into between the City and the delinquent customer, subject to the following terms and conditions:

i. The deferred payment schedule may not extend for a period of more than one (1) year.

ii. The deferred payment schedule provides for a specific payment schedule in addition to payment of current water bills.

iii. The deferred payment schedule shall include the payment of interest at the rate of 1.5% per month compounded monthly.

iv. The deferred payment agreement shall contain such other terms and conditions as the City deems appropriate.

G. Customers who do not comply with the terms and conditions of an executed deferred payment agreement may be reinstated (reconnected) only upon payment of the entire unpaid balance, together with a reconnect fee in the amount of \$75 and payment of a deposit in

an amount equal to three (3) times the estimated monthly bill. Such estimate shall be made by the City based on the average rate of consumption.

Dishonored Checks.

Each check or other instrument tendered to the City for payment of an obligation to the City and returned to the City as a dishonored instrument, shall accrue the maximum penalty, service charge, and other allowable fees for recovery of an amount due allowed by Utah law.

Control of Backflow and Cross Connections Control.

A. Definitions. For purposes of this ordinance, the following words shall be the following meanings:

Water manager means the person designated by the City to be in charge of the Water Department who is invested with the authority and responsibility for the implementation of an effective cross connection control program and for the enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance.

Approved backflow assembly means an assembly accepted by the Utah State Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Drinking Water, as meeting an applicable specification or as suitable for the proposed use.

Auxiliary water supply means any water supply on or available to the premises other than the City's water supply will be considered as an auxiliary water supply. These auxiliary waters may include water from another purveyor's public potable water supply or any natural source(s) such as a well, spring, river, stream, etc., or "used waters" or "industrial fluids." These waters may be contaminated or polluted, or they may be objectionable and constitute an unacceptable water source over which the City does not have authority for sanitary control.

Backflow means the reversal of the normal flow of water caused by either back-pressure or back-siphonage.

Back-pressure means the flow of water or other liquids, mixtures, or substances from a region of high pressure to a region of lower pressure into the water distribution pipes of a potable water supply system from any source(s) other than the intended source.

Back-siphonage means the flow of water or other liquids, mixtures, or substances under vacuum conditions into the distribution pipes of a potable water supply system from any source(s) other than the intended source, caused by the reduction of pressure in the potable water system.

Backflow prevention assembly means an assembly or means designed to prevent backflow that is acceptable to the water manager.

Contamination means a degradation of the quality of the potable water supply by sewage, industrial fluids or waste liquids, compounds or other materials that may create a health hazard.

Cross Connection means any physical connection or arrangement of piping or fixtures which may allow nonpotable water or industrial fluids or other material of questionable quality

to come into contact with potable water inside a water distribution system. This would include temporary conditions, such as swing connections; removable sections; four-way plug valves; spools; dummy sections of pipe, swivel, or change-over devices; or sliding multipoint tubes or other plumbing arrangements.

Cross connection -controlled means a connection between a potable water system and a nonpotable water system with an approved backflow prevention assembly properly installed and maintained so that it will continuously afford the protection commensurate with the degree of hazard.

Cross connection -containment means the installation of an approved backflow assembly at the water service connection to any customer's premises where it is physically and economically infeasible to find permanently eliminate or control all actual or potential cross connections within the customer's water distribution system; or, it shall mean the installation of an approved backflow prevention assembly on the service line leading to and supplying a portion of a customer's water system where there are actual or potential cross connections which cannot be effectively eliminated or controlled at the point of the cross connection (isolation).

B. Backflow Prevention Required. No water service connection to any premises shall be installed or maintained unless the water supply is protected by backflow prevention that controls backflow and cross containment. Service of water to a consumer found to be in violation of this ordinance shall be discontinued by the City after written notification of violation and an appropriate time suspension for voluntary compliance, and service will not be restored until such conditions or defects are corrected.

C. Location of Backflow Prevention. An approved backflow prevention assembly shall be installed on all service lines at or near the property line or immediately inside the building being served; but, in all cases, before the first branch line leading off the service line.

D. Access to Water System. The portion of the customer's water system that is not on public property or public right-of-way shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times to authorized representatives of the City to determine whether cross connections or other structural or sanitary hazards, including violation of this ordinance exist.

E. Backflow Prevention That Is Not Approved. All presently-installed backflow prevention assemblies which are not state-approved backflow prevention assemblies shall be replaced within thirty (30) days of notice thereof with a state-approved backflow prevention assembly.

F. Violations of This Section. If violations of this section exist or if there has not been any corrective action taken by the owner of the premises within ten (10) days of the written notification of the deficiencies, then the City shall deny or immediately discontinue service to the premises by providing a physical break in the service line until acceptable corrective action has been taken in conformance with all statutes relating to plumbing, safe drinking water suppliers, and this ordinance.

This Ordinance, assigned Ordinance No. 14-11, shall take effect immediately.
