


Executive Summary Plan-at-a-Glance


A broad community engagement and outreach process was used to reach out to residents.

Most residents believe it is important to have parks within walking distance of home. Herriman has several gaps in park distribution - primarily in the northwest and southeast areas of the City.

The focus should be on the **expansion** of the Herriman Hills Open Space, preservation of natural drainages and other key natural features and resources unique to Herriman that will provide greater connections with City parks and neighborhoods.

Unique uses should be considered for open spaces where appropriate, as described in the Herriman Hills Open Space Master Plan.

- 1 Establish and implement park standards.
- Upgrade parks with lacking amenities.
- Develop a comprehensive wayfinding and signage master plan, recreation accessibility plan and open space facility standards manual.


KEY RECOMMENDATIONS
