Emergency Care is Coming Closer to Home



On a windy October 25, 2021, Herriman City hosted a highly anticipated groundbreaking ceremony with MountainStar Healthcare for a freestanding emergency center within our city limits. The center will be known as the Herriman Emergency Center and is a Lone Peak Hospital facility that will provide 24/7 care to Herriman residents and surrounding neighborhoods. This building is the first of its kind in Herriman.

The groundbreaking kicked off with MountainStar Healthcare President Greg Engle noting excitement for their ability to respond to the growing demand for health services in Herriman and surrounding cities. "By bringing this freestanding emergency department here, for generations to come, we will be able to improve the care and improvement of human life here in these neighboring communities," stated Engle. With eight hospitals located in Utah, MountainStar is committed to the communities they serve and strives to be an active member of those communities through services and engagement.

Dr. Julie Fox reflected on the trailblazers who led the way to this event. She spoke first of the pioneering spirit of Henry Harriman and his journey as one of the founding fathers of the city. She acknowledged Dr. Frist, a co-founder of the MountainStar parent company HCA Healthcare, and his vision for providing committed healthcare service by caring professionals to promote healthy com-

Holiday Safety at Home



Keep your natural tree hydrated! Check the water level every other day.



Beware of overloaded electrical outlets and extension cords. They are major fire hazards.



Check each light strand for broken bulbs, cracked sockets, and frayed wires.



Don't leave burning candles unattended. Make sure they're secured in a sturdy holder that won't tip.



Don't leave lit fireplaces unattended. Keep combustible decorations away.



Stay in the kitchen when frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food.



In case of a power outage, turning on the stove for heat is not safe. Keep extra blankets, sleeping bags, and warm winter clothes on hand.



Test all smoke and CO2 detectors and make sure batteries are fresh.

Porch Pirates, Burglars, and Scammers: Keep Them Off Your Gift List

Property crimes are some of the most common in Herriman--especially during the holiday season. Make sure the bad guys don't find their way onto your Christmas list.

Package thefts

- Deliver packages to your work, neighbor or to a family/friend you know is always home.
- Install a security camera (this makes HPD investigators' jobs easier!).
- Leave specific delivery instructions such as: leave in a lock box or behind an item on the porch.
- Turn on your delivery notifications to alert you when your package is delivered.

Vehicle thefts/burglaries

- Please lock your car. Most criminals look for easy targets like unlocked vehicles.
- Make sure to close your garage every night. An open garage door makes it easy for the bad guy to grab stuff and run. (Also, since they are in your garage, they might as well check all the car door handles in the neighborhood while they are there.)
- Don't leave valuables in the car (wallet, purse, gifts, backpacks, checkbooks, etc.).

Fraud/scams

- Frauds can be tough to prevent, but one great prevention technique is to freeze your credit. This is fairly easy, inexpensive, and can save you a lot of heartache.
- Do online searches for businesses and reviews. Don't pay up front for a promise.
- Honest companies and government agencies don't have you pay with gift cards.
- When something sounds strange, talk to someone you trust. Scammers want you to make decisions in a hurry and will try to intimidate you.





No Parking When There's Snow

Herriman City ordinance prohibits parking cars on the street when 1) it is snowing or 2) there is snow on the roads from November-April. This is to allow City snowplow trucks the ability to clear roads of snow to make them safe to drive. If cars are in the way, the plows can't safely plow—it's that simple.



When snowplows have cleared major roadways during or after a storm, they will then clear subdivisions and cul-de-sacs. However, plows cannot safely enter and exit cul-de-sacs if there are cars parked on the side of the road.

Remember to keep your car off the road if there's snow and City crews will work hard to keep our streets clear and safe to drive.



Lastly, Dr. Fox referred to HCA's innovators who imagined the concept of the standalone emergency center and made it a reality.

Herriman City is regularly touted as the fastest-growing city in Utah and one of the fastest-growing cities in the country. This facility offers access to high-quality, comprehensive patient care closer to home. The emergency facility will be fully equipped and staffed with board-certified physicians, nurses, and technicians.

This was a great day for the Herriman community. We are delighted to house in our borders the Herriman Emergency Center that will provide around-the-clock care to our residents. Members of the City Council, Unified Fire Authority, Herriman Police Department, and the City staff joined MountainStar Healthcare, Lone Peak Hospital staff, and the news media in breaking ground on the site that will solidify the city's commitment to a safe and healthy community.

The new emergency center is scheduled to open in 2022, featuring 10 patient exam rooms, a comprehensive laboratory, and imaging services, including CT scans, X-rays, and ultrasounds. The facility will be located at 5073 W. Herriman Rose Blvd (13300 S), just south of Herriman City Hall, north of the Walmart Neighborhood Market and 13400 S.
