Enriching the Community with the Friends of Herriman

Last month, the *Friends of Herriman* non-profit organization hosted the Experience Herriman event at Butterfield Park, crowned by unveiling a commissioned puzzle featuring our community. Months of collaboration, creativity, and ideas from community members and leaders were all baked into a wonderful creation by renowned Utah artist Eric Dowdle that captures Herriman's rich culture and history. You can see the enlarged 14-by-11-foot wall version of the puzzle at Fort Herriman Towne Days (see the Towne Days advertisement in this newsletter) and buy a normal-sized one for your home. As Herriman has grown, City leaders have looked for ways to expand the community's service and fundraising capability, resulting in the idea of a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. As residents expressed interest in serving to a greater magnitude, the *Friends of Herriman* was born in 2022 as an avenue for greater community engagement. In a complementary partnership, the *Friends of Herriman* combines the passion and capability of organized volunteers with the City's experience, expertise, and resources. We're grateful that so many residents have become involved and are making a hands-on difference in our community. And there's always room for more, whether it's in fundraising, serving, performing, or anything else someone can bring to the table.

Protect Your Home From Wildfire With Defensible Space

One of the best ways to give your home a chance of surviving a wildfire is by creating and maintaining defensible space. This creates a buffer between your home

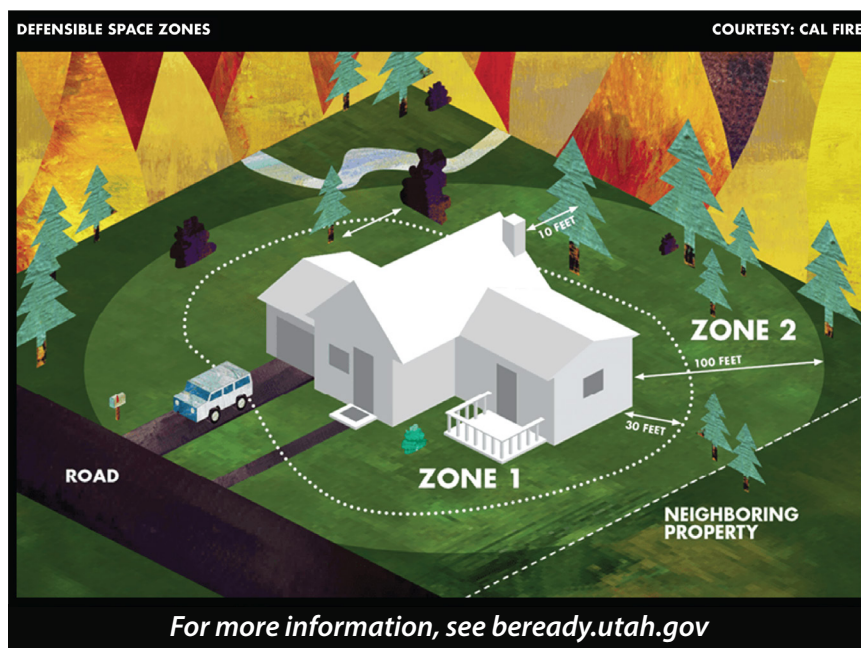
and the grass, trees, shrubs, or wildland area nearby. This space slows or stops the spread of fire, protecting your property and the firefighters defending your home.

Zone 1 — 0-30 feet from your house

- 🔥 Clean out debris from under decks
- 🔥 Move flammable materials like stacks of firewood or propane tanks away from the structure
- 🔥 Remove pine needles, leaves, and other debris from rooftops and rain gutters
- 🔥 Trim weeds or other flammable vegetation to prevent hanging over the structure

Zone 2 — 30-100 feet from your house

- 🔥 Remove dry, dead, and dying grass, shrubs, and trees
- 🔥 Reduce the density of vegetation by spacing plants apart
- 🔥 Remove 'ladder' fuels that could carry fire from the ground into the treetops

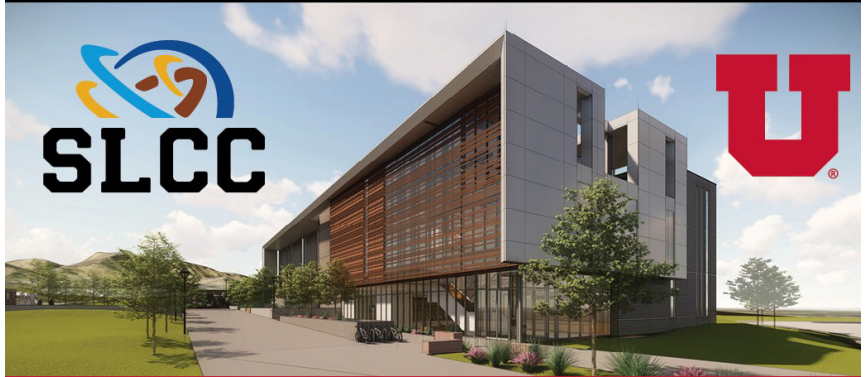

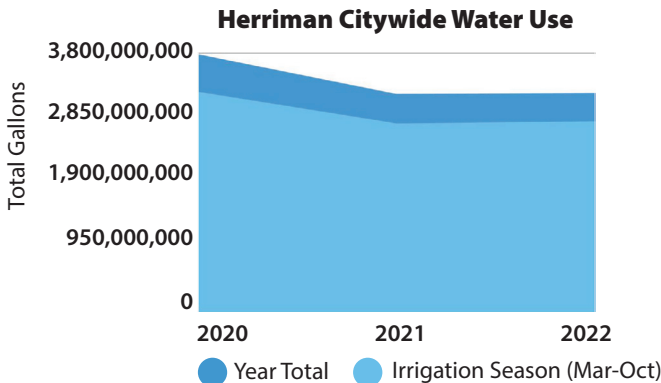

Main Street Widening

The Main Street widening and improvement project is on track! Expected to be completed in early winter, the reconstructed roadway will include improved travel lanes with a center turn lane, bike lanes, curb and gutter, and landscaping.

Occasional traffic interruptions will still occur. Please be patient, plan ahead, and **slow down in construction zones!**

The City Council recently hosted Herriman's first Latino Town Hall, an opportunity for Herriman's rapidly growing Latino community to engage with the City's elected leaders.

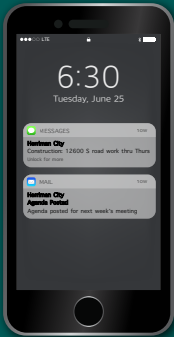
Part of the evening also included a recognition of local Latino high school students for their excellence in a variety of areas, such as academics, athletics, and community involvement.
