#### **Enriching the Community with the Friends of Herriman**

Last month, the *Friends of Herriman* non-profit organization hosted the Experience Herriman event at Butterfield Park, crowned by unveiling a commissioned puzzle featuring our community. Months of collaboration, creativity, and ideas from community members and leaders were all baked into a wonderful creation by renowned Utah artist Eric Dowdle that captures Herriman's rich culture and history. 

## Protect Your Home From Wildfire With Defensible Space

One of the best ways to give your home a chance of surviving a wildfire is by creating and maintaining defensible space. This creates a buffer between your home

and the grass, trees, shrubs, or wildland area nearby. This space slows or stops the spread of fire, protecting your property and the firefighters defending your home.

#### **Zone 1** - 0-30 feet from your house

- Clean out debris from under decks
- Move flammable materials like stacks of firewood or propane tanks away from the structure
- Remove pine needles, leaves, and other debris from rooftops and rain gutters
- Trim weeds or other flammable vegetation to prevent hanging over the structure

#### **Zone 2** — 30-100 feet from your house

- Remove dry, dead, and dying grass, shrubs, and trees
- Reduce the density of vegetation by spacing plants apart
- Remove 'ladder' fuels that could carry fire from the ground into the treetops














#### **Don't Squander a Good Water Year!**

Occasional traffic interruptions will still occur. Please be patient, plan ahead, and **slow down in construction zones**!



UDOT is resurfacing Mountain View Corridor from Old Bingham Highway to 13400 South, including various intersections.
