Council Corner

The Plan for Citywide Fiber-Optic Internet Access

Herriman City is moving forward with plans to construct a citywide fiber-optic municipal broadband network. The dual-purpose project will allow all residents to have **multiple options** for high-speed internet access and connect all City facilities for more efficient and effective services. The City Council has yet to vote on the plan but



expects to make a final decision very soon. Current details about the network are found on www. **herriman.org/fiber-internet**, but we'd like to address a few key points and common questions.

The City Council feels that quality, high-speed internet access is vital to serve the community's needs in our modern era. Fiber-optics is a state-of-the-art technology that can serve our city with reliable, high-speed internet access for decades to come. The network will be built to serve every resident and business in Herriman and can help improve connection for education, telemedicine, communication, remote work, and business development.

The network will be considered a **public utility**, similar to water, sewer, or electricity. Residents can expect a monthly utility connection fee, which will likely be about \$15. This fee will come with a basic level of internet access with speeds up to 10 megabits per second (Mbps) at no additional cost. This is generally enough speed for basic internet browsing and email. Users can upgrade to enhanced high-speed broadband through private Internet Service Provider (ISP) companies that use the fiber-optic network. Simply put, the public utility will own the lines in the ground, and **multiple** private companies can use the network to provide services and compete for customers. Our current projections show that even with a monthly utility fee, the cost of upgraded high-speed internet will meet or even beat current market prices—with a universal, substantial benefit to the community. Residents will also see enhanced municipal services as the network will upgrade the City's ability to manage traffic infrastructure, stormwater flow, water usage, and connectivity for first responders.

It's important to note that no tax money will be used for construction or operation. Because all funding and operation of the network will be overseen by the utility—an entity separate from the City—there is no financial obligation now or in the future to Herriman City or the taxpayers. The

system will be self-sustaining and will not increase your tax burden. The City Council will not approve the project if any City tax funds are needed to support it. And while we believe this project will greatly benefit our entire community, we respect individual property owners' choices. You can opt out if you do not wish to access the network. However, if you change your mind later and want to connect your home to the network, you will need to cover the full cost of connection—likely thousands of dollars.

The City is in the final steps to move forward with the network. Once the project moves forward, construction could start as early as spring 2024 and will take about three years to build fully. We understand you may have more questions, including about impacts on individual properties. We will continually publish information as the project progresses.
