HCSEA Tax Increase

Soon Herriman residents will receive a notice from the Salt Lake County Auditor showing a tax increase, on average, of \$372.92 for the Herriman City Safety Enforcement Area (HCSEA). While this tax increase notice is true, it does not tell the whole story. Since 2012, residents have been paying taxes to the Salt Lake Valley Law Enforcement Service Area (SLVLESA) to provide police services through Unified Police. As of January 2018, the City has withdrawn from the SLVLESA and has replaced it with the HCSEA. These tax areas are set up for police services and the funds may not be used for other purposes.



The SLVLESA is managed by a representative from each participating city and representatives from the County. The Herriman City Council did not feel that the City had adequate control over residents' money and the decision was made to leave that district and form its own.

Will you see a tax increase?

Your tax statement this year will show a tax increase for the HCSEA, but the SLVLESA will no longer show on your bill. **The City is working closely with the Salt Lake County Auditor and the State Tax Commission to ensure that the new rate the City sets will result in no change for Herriman residents.**

What will be the new tax rate for the Herriman City Safety Enforcement Area?

The tax rate will be set at the meeting of the HCSEA on August 16, 2018, at 6 p.m. at the Herriman City Council Chambers. At that meeting, residents will have opportunity to offer public comment. The goal is to provide adequate law enforcement services to the community without raising the cost to Herriman residents.

The proposed rate is .00217, which is estimated to match the rate that Herriman residents have been paying for the SLVLESA.

Will the Herriman City Police Department cost more than contracting with UPD?

The Herriman City Police Department will be operation on September 30, 2018, with 34 sworn officers and three civilian employees. The officers that are being added to HPD have the expertise



for all the specialized services provided by UPD pooled services. Herriman also has cooperative agreements with surrounding cities.

All City budget estimates show that this level of service will be a little lower than the contract cost for Unified Police, which would have included only 24 sworn officers and six shared civilian employees. The expectation is the total cost to be close to the previous billed amount from UPD, but with an increased level of service.

Water District Proposes Tax Increase

The Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District (JVWCD) is proposing a property tax increase. The proposed increase would add an additional 9.01% in property tax revenue. The current JVWCD tax on a home value of \$367,400 would increase from \$74.16 to \$80.83, adding an additional \$6.67. Businesses would increase as well. A business valued at \$367,400 is currently taxed at \$134.84, but with the increase, those taxes would rise by \$12.12 to total \$146.96. The JVWCD held a public hearing on August 8th to offer the public opportunity to voice their comments and address their concerns on the subject.
